LGBT ASYLUM TASK FORCE

This morning we welcome participants from the LGBT Asylum Task Force, a ministry of Hadwen Park Congregational Church, UCC. It is illegal to be LGBTQ in 60+ countries. Folks flee from persecution to the US for safety, but it can take up to two years for their paperwork to be processed and for them to be allowed to work. The Task Force provides housing, food, and connections to free legal, healthcare, educational, and job readiness resources during this waiting period.
